The remit for Police Commissioner at the time of writing is very vague. The role is new to the UK, but not of course to the US, where the idea originated. There is therefore much to be learned.

Godfrey Bloom, UKIP's MEP for Yorkshire & North Lincolnshire:

Humberside Police have been almost completely turned around since the dark days of 2005. I know because I have lived in the area for 30 years and have seen the improvements. This has been due to an excellent management team, working with a particularly sound Police Authority. For far too long policing has been a political football, full of political correctness rather than about catching criminals. We have had good policing in Humberside.

Yet a Police Force is no different to an Army Division, warship or Plc. It is an organic and dynamic being. It can go backwards as easily as forwards, especially with some savage budgetary cuts pending. The Conservatives were perceived as the party of law and order. No longer. With Cameron, Ken Clarke and Clegg, we are seeing the continuation of policies that are failing and deep cuts that will erode police effectiveness.

The role is ill suited to the professional long term journeyman politician. Experience of the wider world is called for. I offer that with my proposed team, see opposite for details of my running mate Mike Speakman and of course 8 years political experience in that lunatic asylum the European 'Parliament'.

Policing by common sense and consensus

Mike and I have seen policing being used as a political football, and driven by ideology rather than common sense. When this happens the public lose confidence.

Police budget and privatisation

"I joined the Police in Liverpool in 1968 and started life as a bobby on foot patrol in Liverpool 8, later to become known as Toxteth.

At that time traditional policing was still strong and beat bobbies were expected to work their beat every day and be there for at least two years. This is where I learned my craft and I took the lessons with me throughout my service.

I held a number of posts in Merseyside and was also seconded to the Home Office for a project to reduce bureaucracy and keep policeman on the streets. I eventually transferred to Humberside Police in 1995 as Assistant Chief Constable Operations. I rose to Deputy Chief Constable before retiring in 2000. Since then I worked as an advisor to Abu Dhabi police helping them to start community policing and implement a strategic plan.
